From the Mayor's Office

I have put a lot of additional pressure on City Staff (particularly Melissa Huhtala) over the last four years to help me initiate a number of new programs to help build community and to move our City into the future. City Staff have not only responded to my requests but have also continued to provide excellent City Services. They are truly a remarkable group of dedicated individuals who serve our City well. Please join me in thanking them for a job well done.

I will continue to serve as your Mayor until December 31, 2014.

URBAN RENEWAL NEWS Phase 1C Wraps Up on West Valley View Project

The contractor for the West Valley View project (Phase 1C) will wrap up final construction details between now and December 15. This includes installation of the underground utility lines to the three houses on West Valley View, powering up the new streetlamps the Main Street extension, and relocating TID's front gate in anticipation of future phases. There will be some grading/clean-up of the gravel parking area near Porto Gelato, new curbing installed near the vacant green building on Talent Avenue and the removal of the double pole near Talent Liquor. A section of the new concrete "bump outs" at the Talent Ave and West Valley View intersection needed to be replaced, as the concrete scoring pattern did not meet the City's needs. Pacific Power will install new LED cobra head lights on power poles along West Valley View which will provide illumination from the roundabout to Talent Avenue. The City's Traffic Safety Commission is studying different options for locating the bus stop, but as of this writing a decision has not been made.

The West Valley View project was first conceived in 2004 and designed during a series of public meetings with the help of over 60 citizens and business owners. The City adopted the design to the transportation element of the City's Comprehensive Plan in 2006 following public hearings

of the Planning Commission and City Council. In 2010, another public process involved over 40 citizens and business owners in the development of the "public open space" between the roundabout and Talent Avenue, and this design concept was approved by the Parks Commission. Half of this "public open space" will be turned into a plaza area (nearest the roundabout) and the other half (nearest downtown) will make up a traditional "grid" style road pattern allowing for on-street parking and low speed auto, pedestrian and bicycle transportation. The plan is to have the landscape finished and the plaza and on-street parking constructed next year.

To get a better handle on the scale and phasing of this long-range project, please take a look at the large 4'x8' construction sign currently located near the roundabout (it may soon be moved closer to Talent Avenue). The sign displays a map of the various phases of construction, and will eventually display visual illustrations for the plaza area that were approved by citizens. Important Winter Weather Water Tips

With winter upon us, now is the time to prepare for the possibility of an extreme winter season. Here are some tips that may prevent costly emergency repairs:

Insulate your plumbing (hot water pipes too) in areas that are not heated such as crawl spaces, garages and outside.

Temporarily seal off crawl space holes during winter with foam or cardboard pieces.

Disconnect garden hoses before freezing temperatures arrive. Place insulated caps on all of your hose bibs.

Before leaving on trips, do not set your thermostats lower than 55*.

During Freezing Weather

Maintain heat in any room that has plumbing fixtures, especially ones with plumbing located on outside walls. Open up cabinet doors under sinks to let the heat in.

Keep a VERY Small trickle of water (during EXTREME cold times only). It is harder for flowing water to freeze. This is most helpful for faucets that are father away from where your water enters the house.

If your pipes freeze, NEVER try to thaw with an open flame. Use a hair dryer or space heater to do the job.

If you are going to be away, ask a friend or neighbor to check your house during cold spells. If something breaks, they can act before it causes too much damage.

WINTERIZE YOUR SPRINKLER SYSTEM

This may be one of the most important winter preparations.
